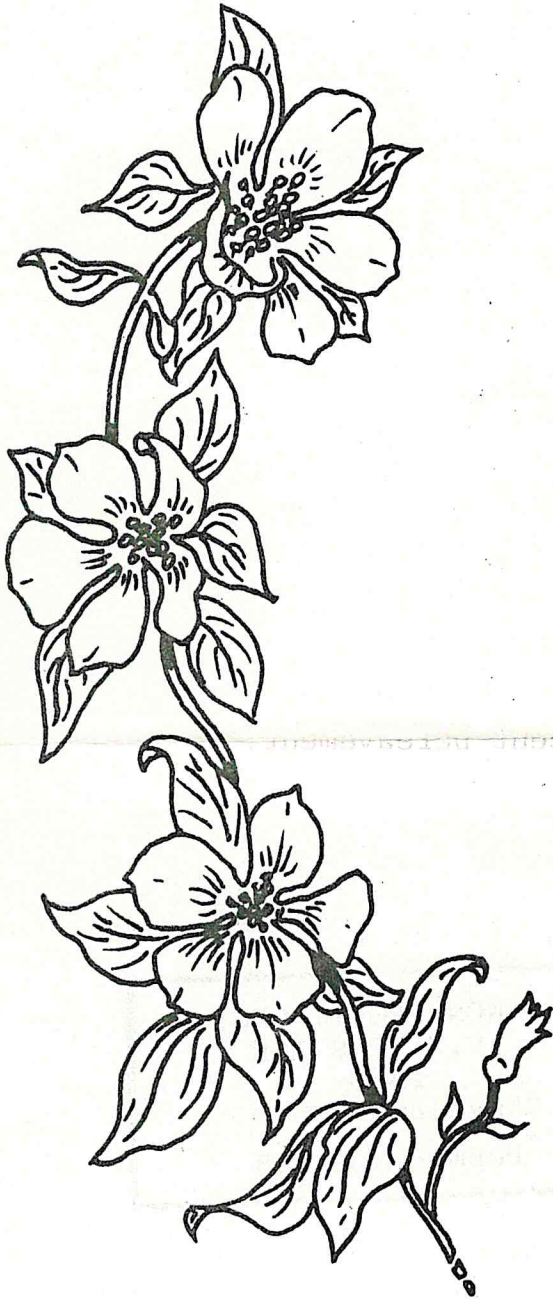

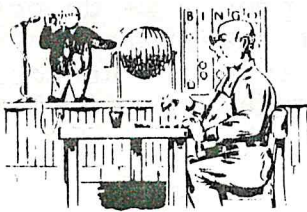
## BIG BINGO

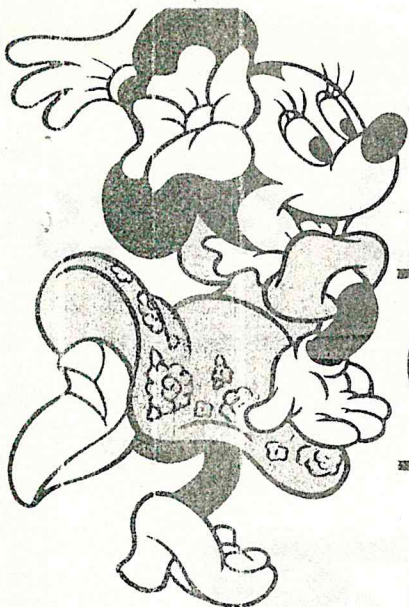

DINNER AND DANCE

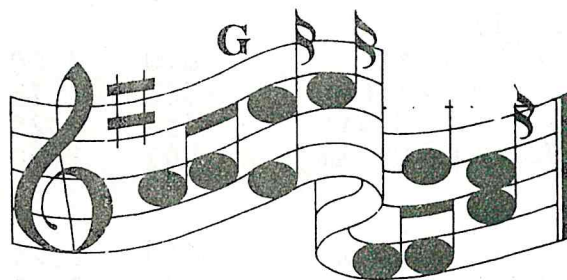
