

### INDEPENDENCE

In 1765 the Englishe Parliament passed the stamp act,
whereby any official writing
had to obtain a stamp. This was
for a fee that went to the
British government and was essentially a tax paid by the
Americans with no benefits received. This complaint among
others, led to the American
Revolution.

In 1774, the 1st Continental congress of the American colonies met in Philadelphia. John Adams was one of the important members, representing Massachusetts. This Continental Congress and its decisions led to the formation of the United States of Amer-By the time the 2nd Continental Congress met one year later, most of the delegates had decided they should have independence from British rule and the Declaration of Independence was adopted July 4, 1776.

In the meantime, the Revolutionary War had begun and with John Adams influence was financed with the help of the French and Dutch. In 1783 - 9 years from the start, the Treaty of Paris was arranged and the United States was recognized as an independent nation.

With Desert Storm over and most of our troops back home, we come again to celebrate July 4, 1991.
