

KITCHEN KORNER

MEAT LOAF CASSEROLE

Butter insides and bottom of baking dish or casserole. Start with a layer of sliced <u>raw potatoes</u>, add a sparse layer of <u>raw onion</u>, next a layer of sliced <u>cooked meatloaf</u>, a layer of potatoes and a sparse layer of onion, a layer of meatloaf and finally a layer of potatoes (do not use cooked potatoes).

Over this pour approximately 1 1/2 to 2 cups of gravy mixed with about 1/2 cup milk.

Cover and bake in a 350 degree oven for one hour. A small or large casserole may be used depending on the number of servings desired. The amount of gravy and milk mixture may be determined by the number of servings and the size of baking dish used.

PINEAPPLE CHEESE PIE

1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese softened
 to room temperature
1/4 cup sugar
1 cup heavy cream, whipped
1 1/2 cups drained Dole Crushed
 Pineapple (#2 or 1 lb. 4 oz.)
1-9 in. graham cracker pie shell

Whip softened cream cheese and sugar together. Fold in whipped cream, then the well drained crushed pineapple. Spoon into pie shell. Chill thoroughly about 2 hours until filling is set. Makes approximately 8 servings.

GRANDMOTHER'S COOKIES

3 cups unbleached all-purpose
flour, sifted
1 cup sugar
1/8 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon baking powder
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup margarine
1 egg, slightly beaten
2 1/4 teaspoons vanilla extract

Combine the dry ingredients in a bowl and slice the butter and margarine over the top, Using a pastry blender, 2 knives, your fingertips or an electric mixer, cut the fat in until you have a mealy texture.

Add the eggs and vanilla. Mix and shape into 2 long rolls. Wrap in wax paper and chill.

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Grease 2 baking sheets. Slice the rolls 1/4 inch thick and bake for 10 minutes.
