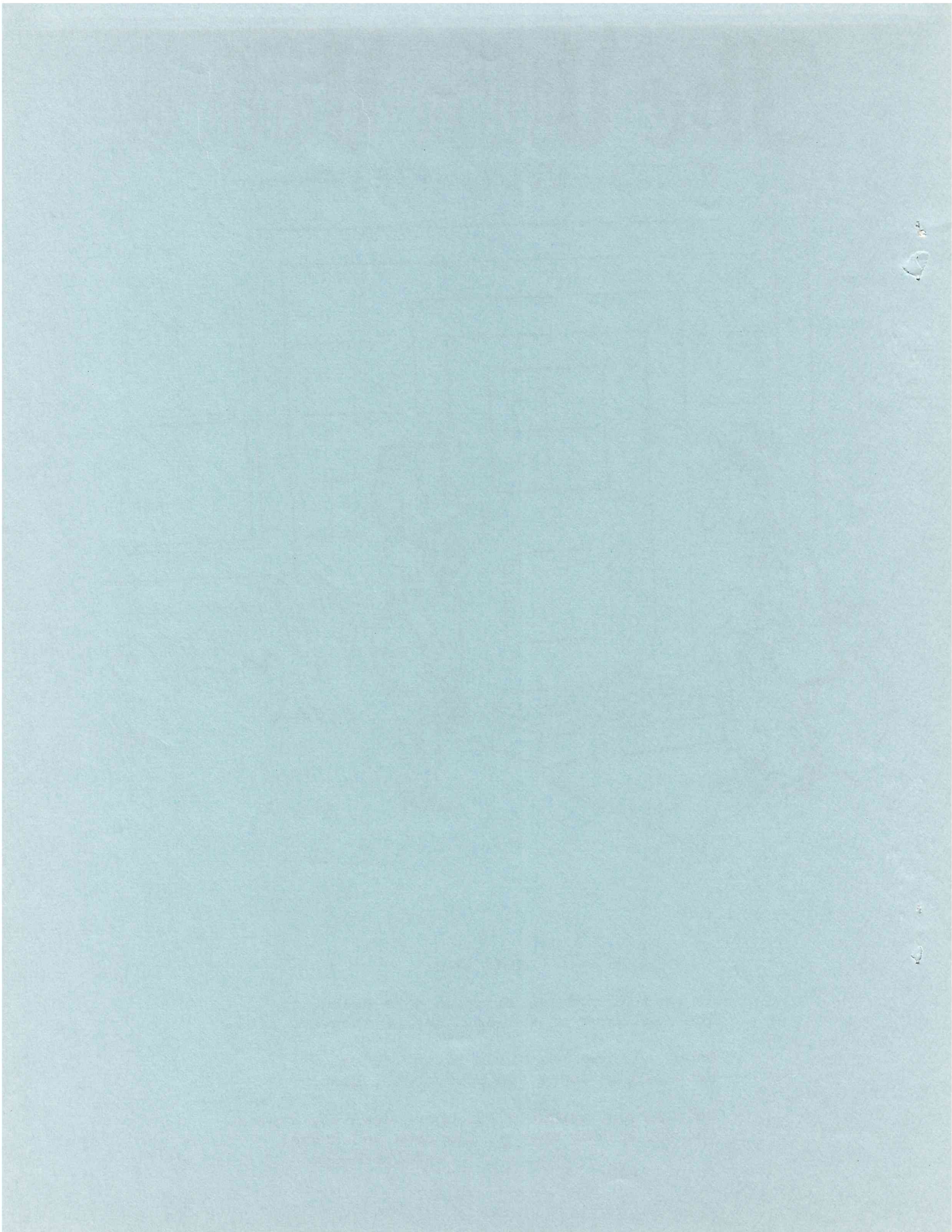
HEAT WAVE

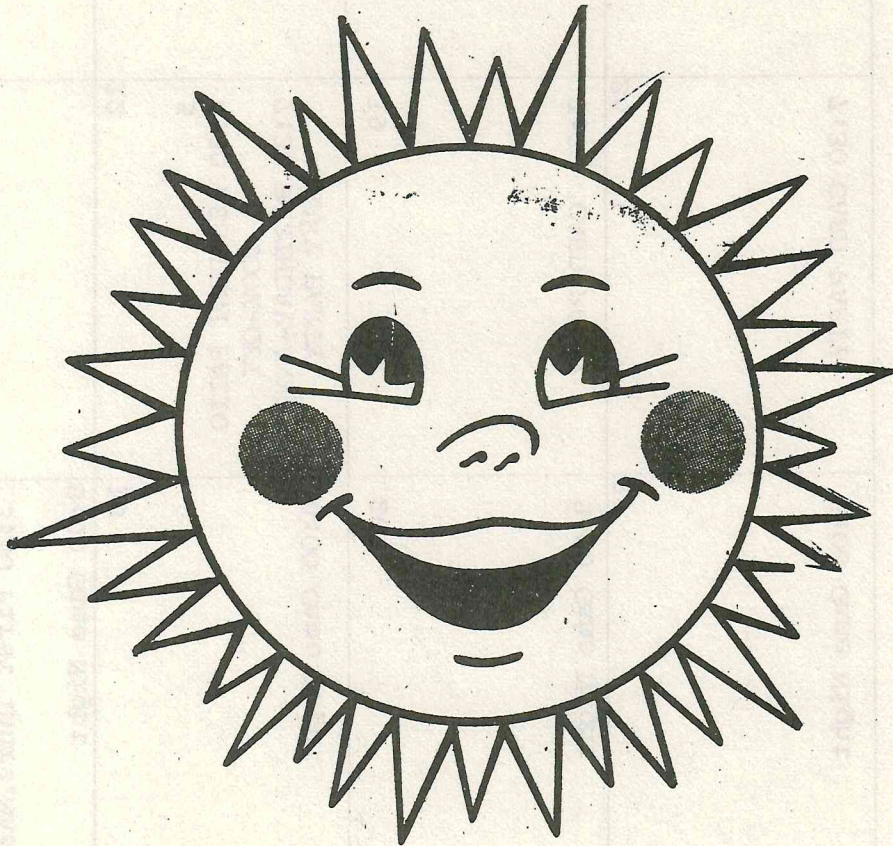
