

KITCHEN KORNER

MEAT AND VEGETABLE CASSEROLE

3 medium sized potatoes, sliced

1 Lb. ground beef

2 carrots, diced

2 stalks celery, diced

2 tablespoons parsley, minced

l onion, chopped

1 can tomato soup

Salt and pepper

Grease a 2-quart baking dish. Layer ingredients in rotation given, seasoning after each layer. Over all pour the tomato soup, adding enough water to cover. Save a few slices of potatoes to cover top. Bake uncovered for 1 1/2 to 2 hours at 350 degrees. Serves 4.

QUICK AND EASY RICE PUDDING

1/2 cup uncooked rice

1/4 cup raisins

2 eggs

1 cup milk

2 cups peeled sliced applies

Grated rind 1/2 lemon

2 Tablespoons margarine

1/2 cup sugar

l teaspoon cinnamon

l teaspoon vanilla

Boil rice till soft. Drain and place in greased casserole in layers with apples, raisins and lemon rind. Beat eggs, milk, softened margarine, sugar, cinnamon, and vanilla. Pour egg mixture over rice. Bake 350 degrees for 1 hour. Serves 6-8.

(May serve with coffee cream). -- Dora Kohn

Cracked eggs can be boiled without any of the white oozing out if salt has been added to the water.

WINE SALAD MOLD

6 oz. pkg. orange Jello
2 1/2 cups boiling water
1 1/2 cups white Port Wine
(add when jello and water cold)
Peach or apricot halves
Cherries

Arrange fruit halves in round mold-cut side up. Place cherry in each cavity and use toothpick to hold in place. Pour gelatin slowly over fruit and let it get very firm. Invert on large plate and serve. Cherry could be wrapped in cream cheese ball if desired.

RICE MUSHROOM CASSEROLE

1 cup rice

1/8 lb. butter

2 cans Campbell's onion soup diluted with 2 cans water (per directions on can)

1 can cut mushrooms (stems and
 pieces)

Saute rice in butter until brown. Remove from heat and add soup and mushrooms. Return to heat and cook slowly on low flame, stirring occasionally for about an hour until the soup and water are cooked into the rice. This can be cooked ahead of time and put into a Corningware or pyrex dish and heated before serving.

"If the corner of a small rug curls, especially orientals, sew a can rubber to the corner. In time the corners will not curl. Also the can rubber helps to keep the rug from slipping."

JUNE BIRTHDAY-ANNIVERSARY PARTY


