


A TIME FOR THANKS



KITCHEN KORNER

GOURMET CHICKEN (France)

l cup rice (not instant rice)
l package dry onion soup mix
l can cream of chicken soup
2 cans water
4-6 chicken breasts
salt
paprika

Mix first four ingredients in 9 9" x 13" baking pan. Lay chicken breasts (skin side up) on top of mixture. Sprinkle salt and paprika on each piece of chicken. Bake in 350 degree oven for 1 1/2 hours.

Serves 5-6

LIMA BEAN SUPPER DISH (Lithuania)

3 T. shortening

1 medium onion, chopped

2 medium green peppers, chopped

2 cups cooked lima beans

1 stalk celery, diced

2 cups stewed tomatoes

1 cup ground cooked ham

l teaspoon sugar

2 T. flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

Heat shortening in large deep skillet, Saute onions and peppers for five minutes, stirring constantly. Add cooked lima beans, celery, tomatoes and ham. Cover; simmer 30 minutes, stirring frequently. Mix salt, sugar and flour. Stir into cooked ingredients. Cook until as thick as desired. Serve hot. If desired, chili powder may be added. Very good with toasted rye bread. Serves 6

MARGUERITES (Italy)

2 eggs slightly beaten
1 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup flour
1/3 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon baking powder
1 cup nutmeats

Combine ingredients in order given. Fill small, buttered cupcake tins 2/3 full. Bake at 350 degrees for 8 to 15 minutes. When cool, sprinkle confectioner's sugar on top.

These are especially good after a heavy meal.

Yield: two dozen

ICE CREAM KOLACHY (Eastern Europe)

4 cups flour

2 T. sugar

2 cups butter

1 pint vanilla ice cream, softened

Filling:

2 cups jam, cottage cheese, cooked prunes, or apricots.

Blend flour with sugar and cut into butter until it resembles fine corn meal. Add partly softened ice cream and blend well. Wrap in foil and chill overnight. Roll out to thickness of 1/4 inch, cut into rounds or squares (3" size). Fill center with 1 teaspoon filling and pinch corners or edges together like a pinwheel. Bake in 400 degree oven 20 to 25 minutes until golden brown. Yield: 7 dozen
