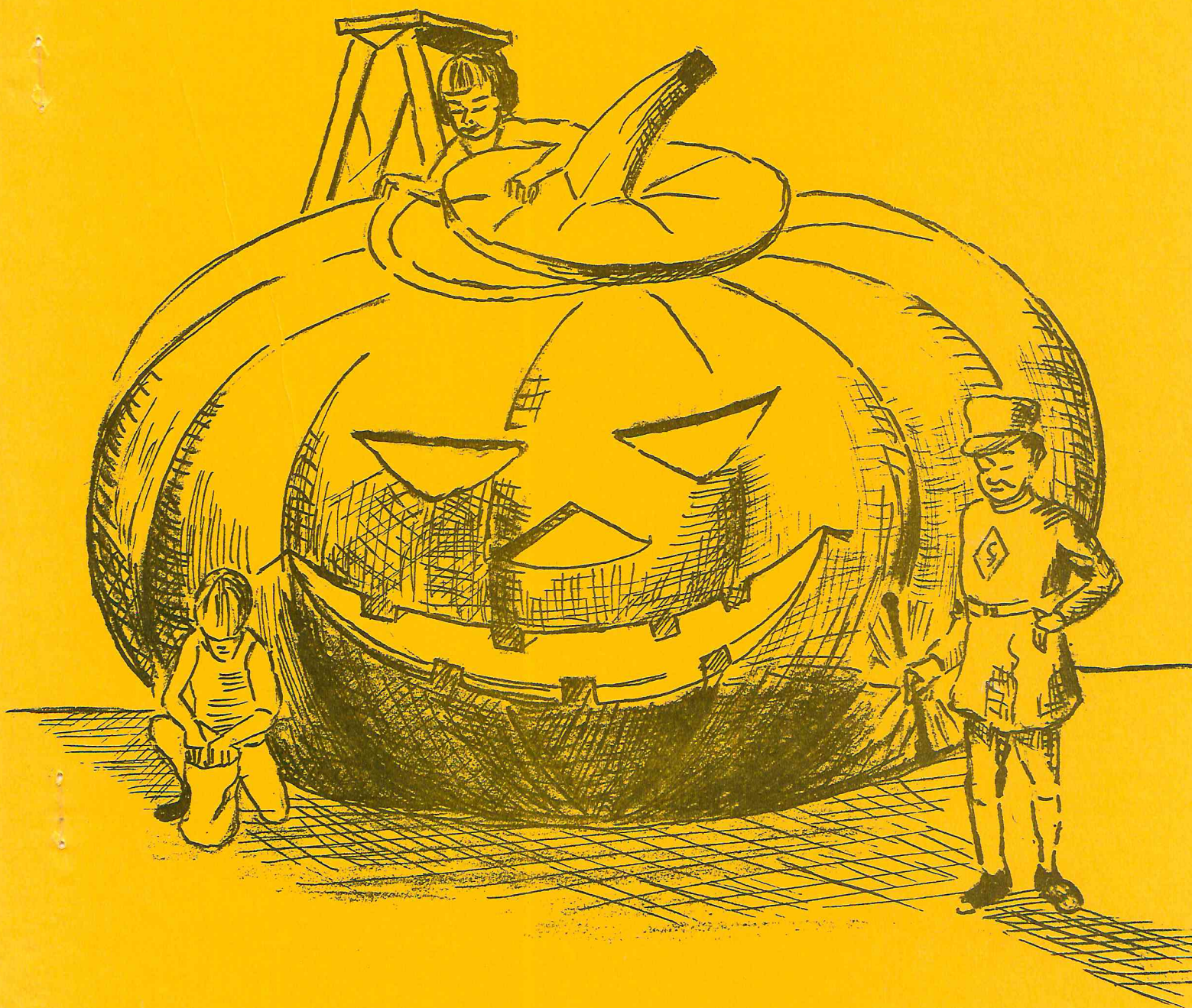


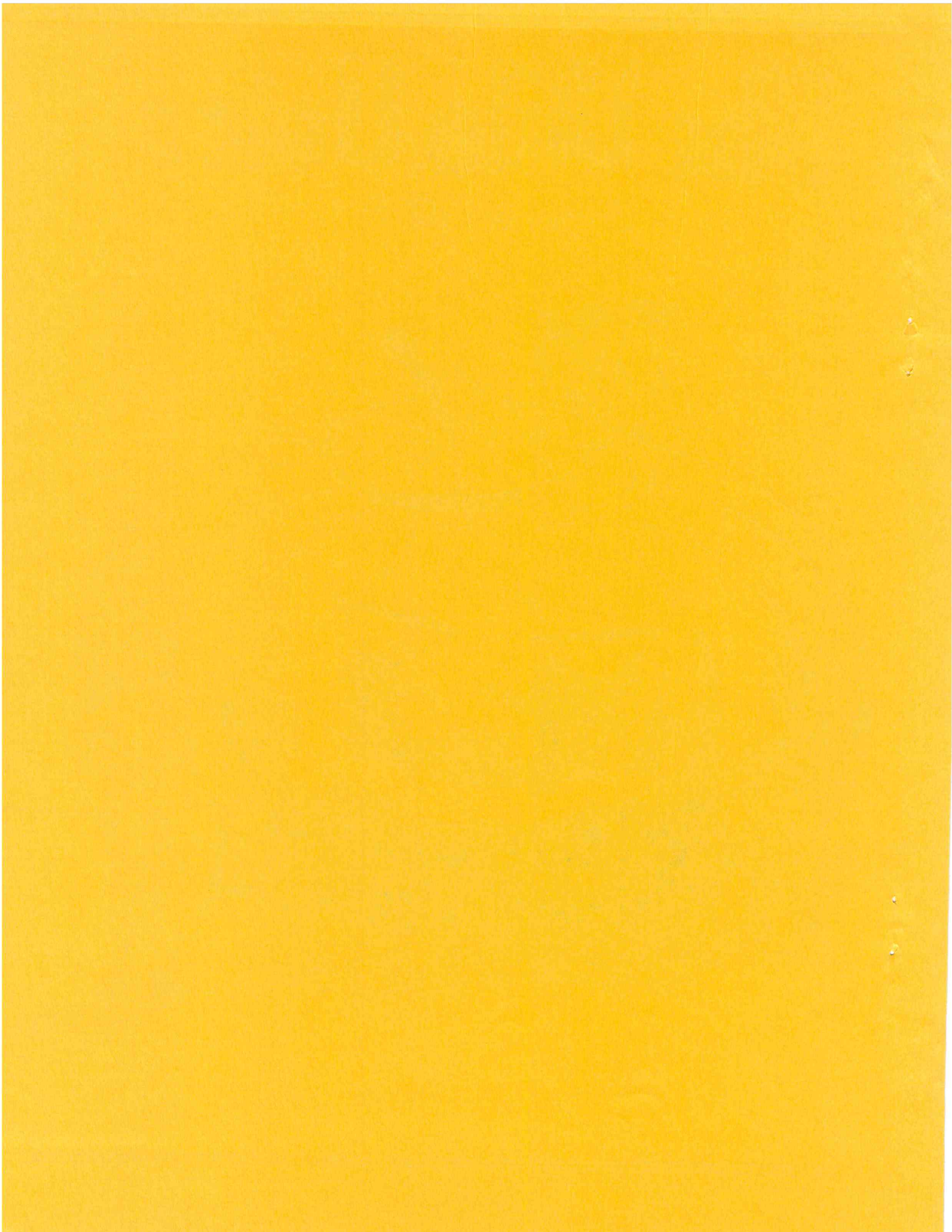

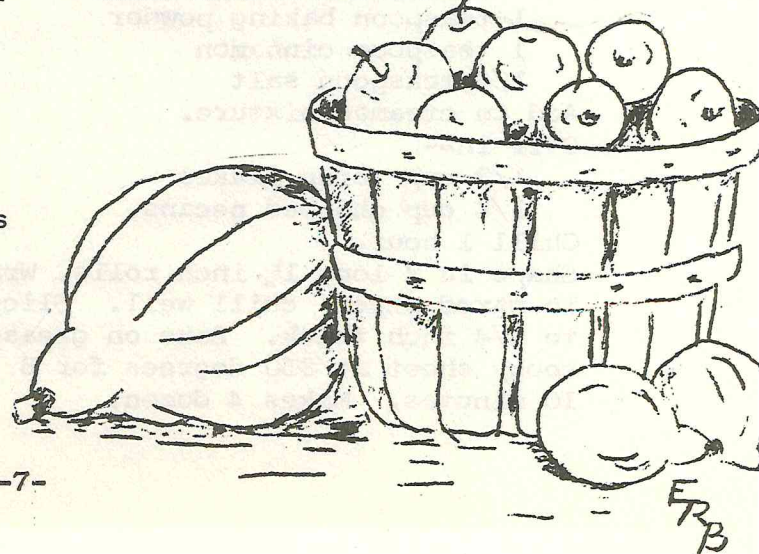

KITCHEN KORNER

SURPRISE MEAT SLICES

Here's a magic way to use that frozen cooked meat loaf or roast.

2 tablespoons fine dry bread crumbs  
2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese  
5 1/2-inch slices frozen cooked meat loaf or 5 thin slices frozen cooked roast beef  
1 egg, beaten

Combine crumbs and cheese. Dip frozen meat slices in egg; coat with cheese-crumbs mixture. Cook meat in small amount hot fat over medium heat, turning once. Cook meat loaf 5 to 7 minutes per side, roast beef 2 minutes per side. Serve with catsup or chili sauce. Makes 5 servings.

CINNAMON CRISP COOKIES

Thoroughly cream--

1/2 cup butter and  
1 cup brown sugar

Beat in--

1 egg  
1 tablespoon shredded orange peel

Sift together--

1 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon baking powder  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/4 teaspoon salt

Add to creamed mixture.

Stir in--

1/2 cup bran flakes  
1/4 cup chopped pecans.

Chill 1 hour.

Shape in 2 long 1 1/2 inch rolls. Wrap in waxed paper; chill well. Slice 1/8 to 1/4 inch thick. Bake on greased cooky sheet at 350 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes. Makes 4 dozen.

CUCUMBER GRAVY (Slovenia)

2 cucumbers, pared and sliced thin  
1 onion, sliced  
2 teaspoons salt  
2 heaping tablespoons flour  
2 tablespoons fat  
1/4 cup vinegar  
1/2 cup hot water  
black pepper to taste

Combine cucumber, onion and salt. Let stand for two hours. Melt the fat, add flour, and stir until dark brown. Combine vinegar and hot water, and add slowly to flour mixture. Squeeze cucumbers, add to above mixture and cook for five minutes. Add black pepper. Mix and serve over mashed potatoes.

May be served with fried pork chops or breaded chicken.

ORANGE SALAD (Hungary)

6 oranges  
2 tablespoons powdered sugar  
4 tablespoons orange liqueur  
2 tablespoons red wine

Peel oranges. Cut in thin slices, removing seeds. Arrange on glass serving plate and sprinkle with the sugar. Sprinkle with the liqueur and wine. Refrigerate until serving time.

Serves 6.

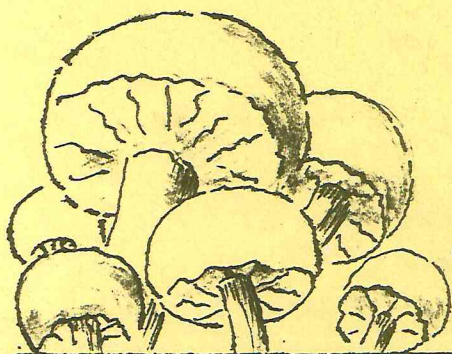

There is a beautiful prayer that goes something like this, "If I can do some good today, if I can serve along life's way, Lord, show me how.
